Framing: Does the student understand purpose? Student generated creative, focused, and manageable questions/aims/hypotheses that address significant issues in the field and are grounded in an understanding of existing knowledge.	<ul> <li>What motivated you to do this work/project? Methodology: How does the student approach the question? Student collected and recorded information/data from self-selected sources and/or from student-performed experiments, choosing or developing an appropriate methodology or theoretical framework.	<ul> <li>How did you select your approach?</li> <li>Did you have to do tests to validate your methods?</li> </ul>
Evaluation: What evidence does the student trust?  Student employed criteria to reveal insightful patterns, similarities, or differences related to the topic. Student reflected insightfully to discuss strengths and/or relevant limitations of the data and/or resources.	<ul> <li>Explain how you organized your data/evidence for display on the poster.</li> <li>Are there assumptions that limit your analysis?</li> </ul>
Synthesis: What meaning does the student derive from the findings? Student synthesized information/data to draw conclusions from the inquiry findings. Student addressed gaps in understanding and relevant implications.	<ul> <li>How does your data support your conclusions?</li> <li>What are the remaining open questions or next steps for your work?</li> </ul>

Clarity: How does the poster help make the findings accessible?
